



This pretty sweater can be used as a bed jacket or sweater.

Crochet Sweater for Prairie Flower Doll

baw 5-15-2010

Materials:

- Laceweight mohair/silk blend yarn (I used Kid Seta yarn)
- Size 1 steel crochet hook

Gauge: 7sc = 1 inch

Special stitches: Link = ch3, dc in third ch from the hook.

Sweater is worked top down starting at the neck. There are no seams to sew in this pattern. The sweater is short, fits loose, and is slightly flared around the bottom.

Row 1: Work 15 links across, ch1, turn.

2: Work four sc in each link across, ch1, turn. 60 sc

3: (Sc in next five sc, two sc in next sc) across, ch1, turn. 70 sc

4: (Sc in next six sc, two sc in next sc) across, ch1, turn. 80 sc
5-6: Sc in each sc across, ch1, turn. 80 sc
7 (this is the armhole dividing row): Sc in next 8 sc, ch12, skip 22 sc, sc in next 20 sc, ch12, skip next 22 sc, sc in last 8 sc, ch1, turn. 36 sc and 24 ch
8: Sc in each sc and ch across, ch1, turn. 60 sc
9-18: Sc in each sc across, ch1, turn. 60 sc. At the end of row 17, do not turn work.
19: Working up the front side of the sweater, sc evenly across the front, around the neck (three sc in each link), and down the other front of the sweater. Stop at the bottom edge of the second front. do not turn.
20: Work reverse sc around all edges of the sweater. Fasten off.

Sleeve:

Row 1: Join yarn with a sc in the second ch from the left side of the sleeve opening, sc in next ch, sc in each sc across the top of the sleeve and in the next two ch, ch1, turn. 26 sc
2: Sc in each sc across and in the next two ch under the arm, ch1, turn. 28 sc
3: Sc in each sc across, skipping two sc evenly, and in the next two ch of the underarm, ch1, turn. 28 sc.
4: Sc in each sc across and in the next two ch of underarm, ch1, turn. 30 sc.
5: Sc in each sc across, skipping two sc evenly, and in the next two ch of the underarm, join, ch1, turn. 30 sc.
6-21: Sc in each sc across, join, ch1, turn. At end of row 21, do not turn work. 30 sc
22: Reverse sc around end of sleeve. Finish off.

Mist lightly with water to remove the 'curl' from your work and let dry.
